To prove a point we found a couple of pieces of tarnished alloy, one lightly tarnished and another heavily tarnished, and went to it. SCREAMIN' SEASONS STUNNING START



The Screamin' Eagle/Vance & Hines Harley-Davidson team proved that last

years title was no fluke when at the opening of the 2005 NHRA POWERADE Drag Racing season both bikes posted career bests and track records at the Gatornationals in Florida.

On Friday, returning champion Hines put Harley-Davidson into the record books with a 6.991-a six- second pass at 196.10 mph. It was the first pass in the six-second range and the honour was worth a \$10,000 bonus from the Mickey Thompson 6-second Club.

Tonglet set a track record, going 197.45mph for a career-best speed along with a career-best elapsed time of 7.007. Hines later ran the same speed but Tonglet did it first.

Unfortunately Both Hines and Tonglet were disappointed with losses in the second round - Hines by red-lighting and Tonglet due to a mechanical gremlin - but they both gained impressive milestones and kicked off the season with high hopes of winning rounds in the future.

"We came into this event wanting both bikes to qualify in the number one and two positions," Tonglet said. "We did that and we got into the six-second range too. I really wanted that mark but if I couldn't do it, I'm just glad it stayed with the Screamin' Eagle team. ... To be able to run a 7.007 at the first race of the season is saying something about the way the season is going to be. We have two great, new bikes and we're close to having two good, consistent set-ups."
